### Materials

1 panel	Chicken Panel - Red (A)	6871P-88
2 ¼ yards	Novelty Chickens/Coops - Multi (B)	6873-44
⅔ yard	Chicken Wire - Beige (C)	6869-44
1 ⅛ yards	Folio - True Red (D)	7755-82*
3 yards	Chick Tossed Allover - Beige (Backing)	6872-44

\*Includes binding

### Cutting Instructions

Please note: all strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage unless otherwise noted.

#### From the Chicken Panel - Red (A), fussy cut:

- (2) 15" x 11" blocks.
- (4) 7" square blocks.

#### From the Novelty Chickens/Coops - Multi (B), cut:

- (1) 16 ½" x WOF strip, centered on chickens. Sub-cut (2) 4 ½" x 16 ½" strips. **CUT FIRST**
- (2) 8" x 62" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
- (2) 8" x 50" LOF strips.

#### From the Chicken Wire - Beige (C), cut:

- (2) 2" x 38 ½" WOF strips.
- (2) 2" x 29 ½" WOF strips.
- (1) 2 ½" x 26 ½" WOF strip.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 2 ½" x 16 ½" strips.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 2 ½" x 18 ½" strips.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 2 ½" x 8 ½" strips.

#### From the Folio - True Red (D), cut:

- (2) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (4) 2" x 11" strips.
- (2) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (4) 2" x 18" strips.
- (2) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 2" x 7" strips.
- (2) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 2" x 10" strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x 41 ½" WOF strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x 31 ½" WOF strips.
- (6) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

#### From the Chick Tossed Allover - Beige (Backing), cut:

- (2) 54" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 54" x 66" back.

### Sewing Instructions

1. Sew (1) 2" x 11" Fabric D strip to each side of (1) 15" x 11" Fabric A block. Sew (1) 2" x 18" Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A block. Trim the block to measure 16 ½" x 12 ½" to make (1) Unit 1 block (Fig. 1). Repeat to make a second Unit 1 block.

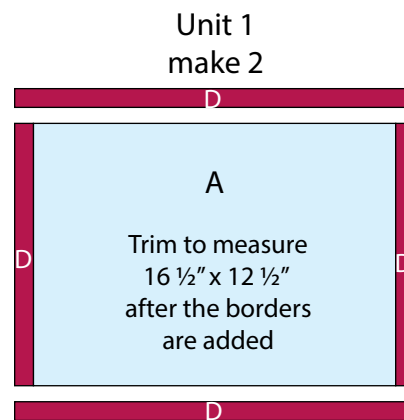

2. Sew (1) 2" x 7" Fabric D strip to each side of (1) 7" Fabric A block. Sew (1) 2" x 10" Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A block. Trim the block to measure 8 ½" square to make (1) Unit 2 block (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (4) Unit 2 blocks total.

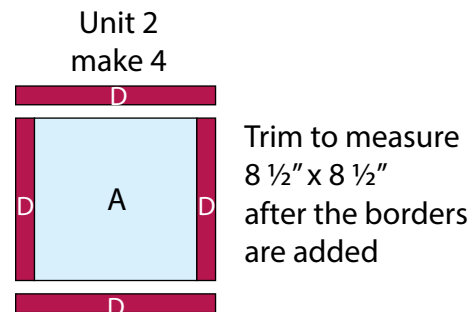

3. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 16 ½" Fabric C strip to the bottom of (1) Unit 1 block. Sew (1) 4 ½" x 16 ½" Fabric B strip to the bottom of the sewn block to make (1) Block One rectangle (Fig. 3). Repeat to make a second Block One rectangle.

4. Sew (1) Unit 2 block to the top and to the bottom of (1) 2 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric C strip to make (1) Block Two rectangle (Fig. 4). Repeat to make a second Block Two rectangle.

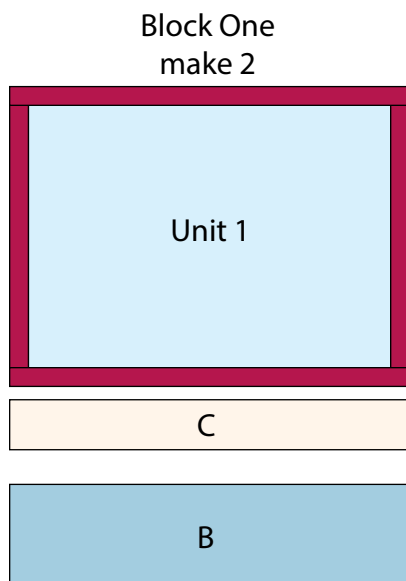

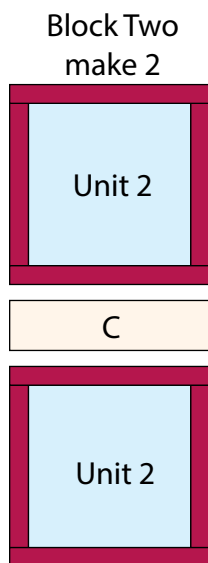

### Quilt Top Assembly

*(Refer to the Quilt Layout while assembling.)*

5. Sew (1) Block One rectangle to the left side of (1) 2 ½" x 18 ½" Fabric C strip lengthwise. Sew (1) Block Two rectangle to the right side of the Fabric C strip to make Row One.

6. Sew (1) Block Two rectangle to the left side of (1) 2 ½" x 18 ½" Fabric C strip lengthwise. Sew (1) Block One rectangle to the right side of the Fabric C strip to make Row Two.

7. Sew Row One, (1) 2 ½" x 26 ½" Fabric C strip and (1) Row Two together, in that order, to make the Center Block.

8. Sew (1) 2" x 38 ½" Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 29 ½" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

9. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 41 ½" Fabric D strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 31 ½" Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

10. Center (1) 8" x 62" Fabric B strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a ¼" from the top edge of the block and stop a ¼" from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.

11. Repeat Step 10 to sew (1) 8" x 50" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start ¼" away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 5).

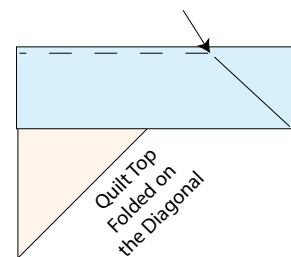

12. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 5), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a ¼" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the quilt top.

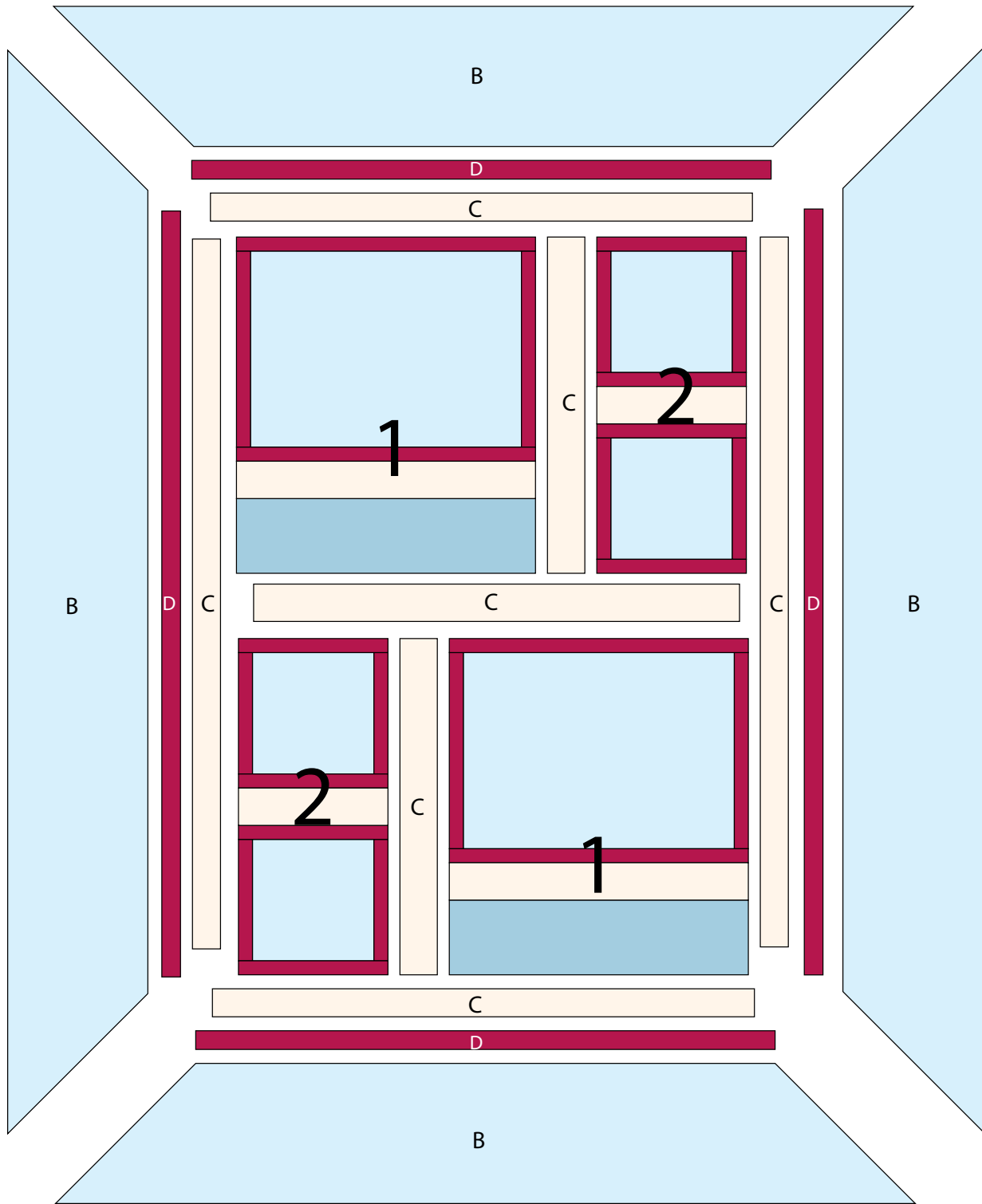
13. Layer and quilt as desired.

14. Sew the (6) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric D strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

15. Bind as desired.
